

OpenSFS Survey May/June 2012 Results

Background

A survey was developed and finalized at the CDWG meeting at LUG. Its intention was to collect information about Lustre usage across the community as input into the OpenSFS long-term support strategy.

Key Findings

- 90 people completed the survey
- Case for adding Scientific Linux to official support matrix
- External OFED widely used; suggests that this should be given more focus during testing
- Only 36% of respondents have formal support arrangements in place

Detailed Findings

1. Which version(s) of Lustre are you running in production today?

This question allowed multiple selections so the sum can exceed the total number of respondents.

3 respondents skipped this question.

As expected, the majority of respondents are running a relatively recent 1.8.x release; however, there are already a significant number of sites running 2.x releases.

Those who selected “other” just did so to elaborate on their Lustre usage relating to one of the provided options.

2. Which Linux distribution(s) do you run in production for your servers?

This question allowed multiple selections so the sum can exceed the total number of respondents.

This question allowed multiple selections so the sum can exceed the total number of respondents.

This only permitted a single selection so the sum of respondents should equal the total number of respondents.

9. Which organization do you represent?

67 Answered this question; 23 skipped it. Only one duplicate organization was reported.

10. If not already a member, what would make your organization more likely to join OpenSFS?

60 respondents skipped this question.

Of those that responded: 7 mentioned a factor outside of OpenSFS control as being significant; 6 indicated that they were in the process of joining; 4 indicated that they would need to know more about the work of OpenSFS; 4 indicated that the fees would need to be lowered; 3 mentioned already being a member; 3 mentioning needing more value-add from membership
